This course builds on the concepts presented in prior nursing courses and develops the clinical skills necessary for successful performance in the job market, focusing on practical applications. Topics include: application of the nursing process, critical thinking, supervisory skills, client education methods, and group dynamics. <p>1) Competency #2: Application of the Nursing Process</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learning Outcome #9: Demonstrate competence in relation to the NCLEX examination was removed <p>2) Competency #6: Professional Development & Outcome</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Newly created • Learning outcome #1 newly created and will state: Demonstrate competence in relation to the NCLEX examination <p>3) Competency #3: Supervisory Skills</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learning Outcome #15 was changed from collaborate to participate. ACEN Presentation	<p>Group sought clarification from Dr. Ard regarding program progression, candidacy / self-study, Maternity & Pediatrics clinical simulation, curricula changes during candidacy, and program outcomes.</p> <p>Per Dr. Ard:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bloom’s Taxonomy sufficient for reflecting progression within courses • TCSG-limitations will be acknowledged, if they are documented. • Programs may be required to write two different curricula if they are in the process of changing credit hours of the curriculum. • Individual program outcomes are those deemed appropriate by individual programs but may be aligned with state regulations. Are not required to be verbatim to PN-12 outcomes. ACEN only requires three program outcomes: job placement, NCLEX/licensure rate & program completion/graduation rate.
