The Old Business stated at the time was that Barbering and Cosmetology are now located under the same website. Some of the forms, documents etc. have also been implemented on the site. It would be wise for everyone in the industry to look over the information on the new website. We also need to pick back up with more discussion on Barber II.

The curriculum revision should be a relatively smooth transition. Splits could be applied to courses such as BARB 1070 and BARB 1080. Changes were also implemented with some of the other Barbering Classes. We also discussed apprentice being trained at the tech schools. This could be done as a continuing education piece. The apprentice can come into the school and benefit from the education provided by the school. The apprentice must be a student of the school in order to be covered in the lab. A test could be required of the apprentice before they could enter into the advanced practical barbering classes. This is

similar to the assessment test. There will be a table discussion in reference to this later.

Angela Mulkey talked about creating Cosmetology for Barbers. Once barbering makes all of the necessary changes with the barbering curriculum, Cosmetology can then proceed with a beneficial Cosmetology for Barbering TCC. This particular TCC will provide Cosmetology knowledge and information not offered in depth by the Barbering curriculum. We would love for our Barbering students to obtain a Cosmetology license and not have to go through the entire program. We also discussed the idea of having one license as an instructor. This would mean that there would not be a Cosmetology Instructor License or a Barbering Instructor License. The license obtained would be for Barbering and Cosmetology. Presently we have Barber license and Cosmetology license.
