CCM PROGRAM RESTRUCTURING 1 HOUR KENNY ADKINS

DISCUSSION	Several changes to CC13, Commercial Construction Management degree were discussed. Specifically, some of the courses in the Gen Ed areas was a little too restrictive. The group decided to go back to the TCSG standard of degree level Gen Ed. Gwinnett Tech wanted to include other CCMN courses in the diploma while Ogeechee Tech recommended other courses.	
CONCLUSIONS	The group agreed to reduce the number of Gen Ed credit hours from 21 to 15. This will allow the addition of 6 credit hours of occupational electives so each college can focus on its specific needs and still work within the standardized curriculum framework. The following changes will be made to the CC13, Commercial Construction Management Degree <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. SPCH 1101, Speech, was removed as a required course in Area I. 2. All specified courses were removed from Area II. Any Area II elective is now eligible. 3. Students have a choice of MATH 1100, 1101, or 1111 are all available options for Area III. 4. All Program Specific General Core courses were removed as required courses. A single 3-credit hour General Core Elective is the only course required for Program Specific Core. 5. CCMN 2010, ACCT 2140, or MGMT 1110 are all acceptable alternatives for Construction Law courses. 6. CCMN 2030 or ACCT 1100 are both acceptable alternatives for Construction Accounting courses. 7. Six hours of occupational guided electives were added to the occupational courses. 8. Program remains at 60 credit hours.

CONCLUSIONS	All pre and co-reqs were removed from all CCMN courses with the following exceptions: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. CCMN 1060, Estimating I, retains a pre-req of CCMN 1030, Construction Graphics. 2. CCMN 1070, Estimating II, retains a pre-req of CCMN 1060, Estimating I. 3. CCMN 2080, Sustainable Design and Construction, retains a pre-req of CCMN 1020, Building Technologies and Methods.
