Agenda Topics/Discussion

Welcome & Introductions

Sasha Kahiga welcomed all participants and asked everyone to sign in using the WebEx chat to ensure their attendance was captured and recorded. Sasha introduced herself and asked each participant to introduce themselves. Sasha provided a few housekeeping points and a PowerPoint overview, explaining how to navigate the WebEx button options.

Review of Agenda

Sasha reviewed the agenda and asked the group if other items needed to be added for discussion. The group agreed with the agenda.

TCSG Updates

Sasha explained to the group that there may have been some “hot button topics” mentioned at the colleges, and she wanted to provide an overview of a few things. Sasha began explaining E-Campus. She informed the group that E-Campus is a platform that allows colleges to leverage instructional capacity for increased access to programs regardless of student location. She further explained that E-Campus comprises technological advancements that support the overall mission to improve the student experience from enrollment through graduation, leading to positive workforce development. Sasha noted that since E-Campus is a platform that can be used for instructional capacity, the E-Campus department is housed within the ITDR division of the System Office.

Sasha further explained that colleges could utilize E-Campus within programs that would like to offer a particular course that they may not have the faculty in place to teach. Sasha further noted that E-campus could be helpful for students who may have failed a class, and instead of waiting another year before the course is offered again, the student can enroll in the E-Campus course if offered. Sasha noted that there are many benefits to E-Campus and informed the group of the E-Campus director, Dr. Carter. She advised the faculty to become familiar with the offerings of E-Campus and not hesitate to contact Dr. Carter with questions.



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Sasha began discussing the purpose of Georgia Virtual Technical Connection (GVTC). Sasha explained to the group that GVTC provides support, guidance, and assistance to the state's Technical Colleges in the design, development, and delivery of distance education technology-based learning initiatives and serves as the primary conduit for distance and technology-enhanced education. Sasha noted to the group the various faculty-development opportunities GVTC offers throughout the year and the next training date was May 19th, 2022, titled Fix You Content Day. Sasha informed the group that detailed information would be emailed to the colleges.

Sasha began discussing the Academic Affairs (AA) department at the System Office. Sasha informed the group of the various special projects and articulation agreements the AA team worked on. Additionally, Sasha explained the State Board process to the group and where the group can access imperative documents & information via the AA web page.

Curriculum Review

Sasha explained the various standard programs within the Radiologic Technology PAS Group of the curriculum database. Sasha provided the group with the following curriculum that needed to be reviewed. She explained to the group that she included the standard program and courses that were not checked during the last IFCC meeting.

- Program Standards
 - AM13: Advanced Medical Imaging
 - Based on the KMS reports, there were a total of 2 colleges offering the AM13 program.
 - CT91: Computed Tomography Specialist
 - Based on the KMS reports, there were 12 colleges offering the CT91 program.
 - IS51: Imaging Science Services Assistant
 - Based on the KMS reports, no colleges were offering the IS51 program.
 - MA11: Mammography
 - Based on the KMS reports, there were 5 colleges offering the MA11 program.
 - MRI1: Magnetic Resonance Imaging Specialist
 - Based on the KMS reports, there were 7 colleges offering the MRI1 program.
 - RT21: Radiologic Technologist Assistant
 - Based on the KMS reports, there were 3 colleges offering the RT21 program.
 - RT23: Radiologic Technology



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- Based on the KMS reports, there were 19 colleges offering the RT23 program.
 - Standard Courses
 - MRIM (Medical Resonance Imaging)
 - RADT (Radiology Technology)
 - ISMA (Imaging Science Assistant)

Sasha explained to the group the sections of the program and course standards that needed full review for possible modifications. Sasha noted that each course should have additional pre-requisites other than “program admission.” Sasha opened the floor and asked the group if there were any updates from accrediting agencies or regulatory bodies. There were none. Jennifer Lathren (WGTC) mentioned contrast was removed entirely from Image Production, and a small review of the RADT courses would be beneficial.

Sasha asked the group if they would like to create an Executive Board/Committee to complete the review or sign-up for courses. The group requested that a sign-up sheet be sent out. Jennifer Turner (GTC) mention that the sign-up sheet includes programs/courses such as mammo & CT. Sasha agreed and made a note. Jennifer Lathern (WGTC) asked about the expected turnaround time for this review. Sasha stated that the IFCC could meet again in May or June to review the suggested revisions made by the course volunteers.

The group agreed that would be enough time. Sasha discussed the revision “rule of thumb” to the course/program standards. Sasha asked the group if there were any questions. There were none.

Conclusion/Action Items

Sasha thanked the group for their hard work, participation, and valued feedback. Sasha asked if there were any additional questions, comments, or concerns. In response, the group thanked Sasha and did not have any other topics to address. Sasha informed the group of their next steps and concluded the meeting.
