TICKET INFORMATION:

To meet the current nurse aide shortage within the state of GA, the Nurse Aide/Patient Care Assistant (NAPC) IFCC met on December 14, 2020 to develop a program that can meet industry needs and the Governor's initiative. The IFCC developed a TCC designed for students to complete within one semester (preferably 8 weeks) thus, allowing students to complete the program and began working in a timely fashion without jeopardizing training and education quality.

The NAA1: Nurse Aide Accelerated TCC has been designed to have a total of 9 credit hours as opposed to the 13-15 credit hours of existing Nurse Aide TCCs and still be classified as a Basic Workforce & Entry Level TCC. There are only two required courses listed within the TCC. The existing ALHS 1090: Medical Terminology course has a total of 2 credit hours and will be a co-

req to the newly created NAST 2100: Nurse Aide Accelerated course. The IFCC developed the new NAST 2100 course using the current NAST 1100: Nurse Aide Fundamentals course as a guide. The new NAST 2100 course is 7 credit hours, with 150 contact hours as compared to NAST 1100 which is 6 credit hours with 135 contact hours.

Overall, the NAA1: Nurse Aide Accelerated TCC will be a new standard Nurse Aide program within the curriculum database that will provide an option for colleges seeking a shorter Nurse Aide program. The TCC will not impact the current Nurse Aide programs or the NAST 1100 course currently being taught at the colleges.
