TICKET INFORMATION:

The AD13: Associate Degree Nursing (Bridge Option) program is an institutional developed program belonging to Southern Regional Technical College. In the efforts to assist the college in providing more clinical opportunities for the nursing students due to some clinical sites lacking a Pediatric Floor for care, the college has requested that the 2010 version of the RNSG 2910: Life Transition III: Obstetrics (4hrs) and the 2010 version of the RNSG 2920: Life Transitions IV: Pediatrics (4hrs) course be combined into one class; with credit hours combined as well.

The college has requested that the RNSG 2910 course number remain and a new course name be provided once combined. A 202116 version has been created and now reads RNSG 2910: Life Transitions IV: Maternal/Child Nursing Care with a total of 8 credit hours. A 202116 version of the AD13 program was created to remove the 2010 versions of RNSG 2910 & RNSG 2920, replacing both courses with the 2021 version of the RNSG 2910 course. Overall, the changes did not impact the total amount of contact or credit hours of the program and will remain at a

total of 61 credit hours. The program will be ratified at the State Board meeting in August for implementation in Fall 2021.
