TICKET INFORMATION:

When all Program Reviews were paused last year, the Logistics and Supply Chain Management review was almost complete. It was scheduled to be presented to the Presidents' Council.

With the re-introduction of the Probe process, the IFCC met on March 25, 2021 to move forward with the curriculum review. The eleven colleges that offer a degree in this program were represented. Also in attendance were four VPAAAs, one VPIE, and seven Deans.

Throughout the years, the Logistics & SCM IFCC has regularly updated their curriculum. As a result, the changes to course content that were recommended during the Program Review were minor. They consisted of edits to some learning outcomes.

The current diploma (LAS2 Logistics and Supply Chain Management) was rather robust, so the total credit hours were reduced from 55 to 40-41 hours. Based on industry input, the following courses were removed: Principles of Management, Labor Management Relations, and two upper level supply chain management courses. EMPL 1000 was also removed. The SCMA and LOGI courses remain. The changes are illustrated on Attachment A – Diploma Crosswalk.

The adjustments to the degree (LAS3 Logistics and Supply Chain Management) provide more course choices through new and expanded 'or' statements. For the financial accounting

requirement, MGMT 1130 Managerial Accounting and Finance was added as an alternative to ACCT 1100 Financial Accounting I. Feedback from industry indicated that managerial reports were of more interest than general bookkeeping or journaling in SCM. The spreadsheet course options were expanded and now include ACCT 1120, BUSN 1410, and CIST 2128. The importance of MGMT 2210 Project Management resulted in it being included in two course clusters. And, as noted under the diploma summary, the LOGI and SCMA courses remain. Attachment B – Degree Crosswalk outlines the changes.

During the Program Review process, another recommendation to the proposed degree and diploma was a name change from ‘Logistics and SCM’ to ‘SCM and Logistics’. The impact of changing the name was re-examined. It was decided to retain the current name for the degree and diploma.

Although the removal of EMPL 1000 was deemed acceptable during the Program Review process, its value in all diploma programs was later re-affirmed by college Presidents so the course will remain in the diploma.

In addition to the above programs, LOGI and SCMA courses can be found in other programs. They include institutionally-developed Logistics and Supply Chain Management programs, but are also in other program areas. For instance, there is a Logistics Specialization in the Business Management degree. The attached spreadsheet lists the 26 programs that have one or more updated LOGI and/or SCMA courses. All the courses are 3 credit hours so there is no change to a program’s total credit hours.
