III. Updates/Impact of CDL Changes Impacting Programs

Steve Conway, TCSG

- A. New Rules take effect Feb. 2022
- B. Applicants for Class A or B CDL license must complete a registered training program.
- C. TCSG colleges are registered training program.
- D. When students pass with an 80 or above on test, information is entered into a national data base.
- E. Each college will have a POC whose responsibility it will be to enter information into database and to ensure that students entering a Lineworker program is in the data base.
- F. Students must complete CDL training before entering Lineworker program.

IV. Discussion: What Must Change and How to Manage:

After much discussion, 2 solutions were presented:

- A. Strip out CDL training content from ELCR 1860, and
- B. Require students to complete CDL training first. Colleges retain flexibility to schedule programs to meet this need. One example is to schedule CDL first part of term, Electrical Lineworker 2nd part of term. But – colleges will determine based on institutional and student needs.
