1. Clinical Site Discussion- Dr. Ray Perren
A federal Louisiana judge has set aside immunization mandates. We continue to do what we were doing before the federal mandate. If hospitals require vaccine, then those continue. If they require both faculty and students to be vaccinated, then the college can decide to reassign the faculty. The college president may need to discuss with Josh McKoon.
2. iOS App Development for Swift- Sandra King
Sandra provided update on Apple training.
Ask the colleges to send her update on iOS program status.
3. Financial Aid Risk Reviews-James Chiara
James stated that in person reviews would resume in 2022. The teams will need about 4 volunteers to help out. It would be great if a member of college going through a review would agree to evaluate another. Several folks volunteered through the chat.
4. Computer Science- Dual Enrollment- Sandra King/Derek Dabrowiak
TCSG has been contacted by GaDOE to assist with providing CIST courses via eCampus. Based on conversation with GaDOE, the following courses were identified to offer in a pilot spring 2022:

5. Hybrid/Electric Vehicle Repair Technician- Steve Conway
Steve thanked the VPs for volunteering various automotive faculty to help work on a new EV/Hybrid Vehicle curriculum over the summer. The group met almost weekly and was successful in creating 4 new AUTC courses to cover this emerging training area. The group then worked with Augusta Tech to revise their existing EV/Hybrid Tech TCC which only had one course covering these areas. The revised TCC is now 19 credits and contains one standard AUTC course along with the 4 new ones. Once approved by the state board tomorrow it will be visible and available for adoption in KMS. Steve asked colleges to look at this new TCC and to discuss with their advisory committees in coming weeks and months. Dr. Perren added that production type training in the EV area would also likely be needed in coming months.
6. Articulation GaDOE- Early Childhood- Dr. Nathalie Dames
Dr. Dames shared a document listing articulated ECCE courses and an assessment option. Agreed upon, and will be moved forward.
7. Articulation GaDOE – NCCER Carpentry, NCCER Welding, Criminal Justice – Sandra King
Sandra provided an update. NCCER Carpentry was approved and will be moved forward. NCCER Welding and Criminal Justice updates were provided. Both groups are developing the required assessment and will then be moved to IFCC. No VPAA expressed concerns.
8. Articulation- USG- Morris Brown- DeVry- Dr. Kathryn Hornsby
 - Kathryn shared document listing suggested courses to add to the USG list. This will be discussed with the presidents at the January 24/25 meeting.

- Kathryn showed the TCSG intranet website and where the signed articulation agreements reside.
 - Working on articulation with Morris Brown, who would like an agreement with each college.
 - No further information on Southern Poly/KSU.
 - Kathryn will be sending out a document to review existing listing USG articulation agreements.
9. eCampus Update- Dr. Kathryn Hornsby/Robert Keown
Robert stated that the communications between colleges are going really well now. The spring course alignments are now available. On December 3rd the team will start uploading the courses and this process will take 3-4 weeks. Robert closed by stating the fall satisfaction surveys are also out now. Results can be shared soon.
10. GVTC Update- Robert Keown
Robert stated that the SAS migration is taking place currently. Six colleges have already been migrated. The remaining college migrations will take place over the Christmas break and be ready in January.
