After discussing the PH23 curriculum with Karen Shacham, Photography Program Chair at Atlanta Technical College, she agreed to add more guided electives to this program because the degree was initially set up incorrectly in the KMS program standards. The new version offers more electives instead of incorrect and unintended course duplication. The changes were made to reflect the overall course content and course work. Total credits will remain the same at 61 credit hours. According to Ms. Shacham, the program is limited and adding more electives would give student more elective choices and increase graduation rates. The newer version (202412) will be sent to State Board for approval in early September.
