### TICKET INFORMATION:

The Nurse Aide PROBE voting period ended on Tuesday, September 3<sup>rd</sup>. The PROBE results are as follows:

#### **Geriatric Care Assistant (GC11)**

- This program is intended to replace the GC51: Geriatric Care Assistant program.
- 17 colleges voted
- 16 colleges voted “yes”

- 1 college voted “no” with the following comment: *We have students on the Accelerated Career path starting with the GC51 Geriatrics TCC in 10th grade and then starting the Nurse Aide path in the 11th grade. We suggest keeping GC51 as an option for these students. GC11, as proposed, will not allow them to take Geriatrics courses first. If the new curriculum will enable them to take Geriatrics first and is still an option for Accelerated Career Dual Enrolled students, then we support the change.*
- In response, CPS has contacted the Secondary Initiatives to determine the best solution for this college.

**Patient Care Technician/Assistant (PCT5)**

- This program is intended to replace the PC21: Patient Care Assistant program.
- 18 colleges voted
- 18 colleges voted “yes”
- There are no comments to address for this program.
